To the Abbotsford City Council:

We are coming in front of you, on June 6th, to ask that you vote to renew our kennel license. We are now officially a “non-profit organization” and are still working towards our goal of moving to the country someday. We have received letters from people in surrounding areas telling us we are doing a “wonderful” thing. In fact, we have never received, or even heard of, a complaint about 9th Life Rescue.

We have enclosed the following documents for your review before voting:

- 1) “Special Limited Exemption Permit” application;
- 2) “Articles of Incorporation – Nonstock Corporation”, “Articles of Amendment – Nonstock Corporation and “Employer Identification Number” notice from the IRS;
- 3) Support letter from Scott Suder;
- 4) June 13, 2007 copy of “Tribune Phonograph’s” story about us entitled “Kitty Sanctuary”;
- 5) Letter from Pam Jaffke, Veterinarian/Owner of Dairyland Vet Clinic, Owen, Wisconsin;
- 6) “9th Life Rescue & Sanctuary – Our Story”; and
- 7) “9th Life Rescue & Sanctuary – Rescues”.

The last two documents are off of our website – you can look this up at 9thliferescue.org if you wish to see a little more. There are more changes being added to the website soon too.

WHAT WE DO:

A couple of months ago, we received a call from Taylor County Humane Society asking if we could place a cat. They had received a phone call from someone in Madison stating that his ex-wife was going to “dump” his cat. He can no longer have his cat, so they asked if we could find a home so the cat would not have to be brought to their shelter. We had a home within an hour and took the cat the next day to her new home.

One week later, Jacqui Fons called stating that her brother’s cat had been walking like it was drunk and with its head tilted to the side, but they were out truck driving and needed Jacqui’s help. We advised Jacqui to take the cat to a vet, however, that day we were being hit with a blizzard. Instead, she wanted to bring the cat here. In a secluded room, I examined the cat. It

Schraufnagel nominated Lange for 2011 Chairman. **Motion Raatz/Kilty to for Lange to be chairman for 2011 Police Commission.** Motion carried without negative vote.

Under part time summer Officers: Chief Gosse spoke on the need for more Officers' during the summer. They need to be certifiable. Mostly working weekends and help with transportation to County Jail. Chief Gosse has a few candidates in mind and will be contacting them. **The plan is to hire two part time Officers.** The full time Officers will have first chance at the overtime. **No motion is needed, but both Councils should be informed.**

Under Chief's report: all the cars are in good working condition. Chief Gosse talked to AT&T about the large telephone bill. There was a final bill figured after moving from the old building to the new Public Safety Building. Chief Gosse got the bill reduced to \$150.

The next meeting was scheduled for June 13, 2011 at 6:00 pm.

Motion Schraufnagel/Kilty to adjourn at 6:15 pm. Motion carried without negative vote.
